GOALS

What is the Proskomide? (Preparation of Gifts) When does the priest prepare the Gifts?

(*Note for teachers:* prosphoro is one loaf of bread; prosphoron is one loaf of bread but an older and more formal way of saying it; prosphora is more than one loaf of bread)

The explanation below is in reference to pages 19 - 22 in "Christ Amongst Us." -

Every week, someone from our parish bakes a special kind of bread, called prosphoro, and brings it to our priest. Have you ever seen any of your parents or grandparents making this special bread? Prosphoro is a gift we are offering to God.

Our priest is oftentimes the very first person to arrive at the church. He has lots to prepare before the Divine Liturgy begins! (Show the kids the prosphoro printout) He takes the special loaf of bread - the prosphoro - and begins to say prayers as he carefully cuts the bread. This is called the Proskomide and happens before most of us arrive at the church.

(Show the kids the spear, Lamb, paten, wine, and the pieces of bread for the Theotokos, for the angels and saints, and for the living and the departed as you explain the following)

The first piece that Father will cut out is the middle square of the prosphoro. This is called the Lamb. Then Father will place it on a special plate called a paten.

After this, he will pour water and wine at the same time into the chalice because water and blood came out of Jesus' side when a soldier pierced his side with a sword while he was hanging on the Cross.

Next, Father will cut the large triangle out of the bread. This piece is for the Theotokos. Does anyone remember who the Theotokos is? (Yes, she's Jesus' mommy!) Then he cuts out the tiny triangles for the angels and all the saints. Next, Father prays for specific people who are living and who have died. Everyone is represented on this special plate called a paten.

(Show asteriskos to students) Finally, our priest will place a cross shaped metal strip, called the asteriskos, over all the pieces of bread on the paten and then a cloth is placed over all of it.

(Show the kids the paper Lamb, paten, and chalice as you explain the following)
The first piece that Father will cut out is the middle square of the prosphoro. This is called the Lamb. Then Father will place it on a special plate called a paten.

After this, he will pour water and wine at the same time into the chalice because water and blood came out of Jesus' side when a soldier pierced his side with a sword while he was hanging on the Cross.

Next, Father will cut the large triangle out of the bread. This piece is for the Theotokos. Does anyone remember who the Theotokos is? (Yes, she's the mother of God!) Then he cuts out the tiny triangles for the angels and all the saints. Next, Father prays for specific people who are living and who have died. Everyone is represented on this special plate called a paten.

(Show paper asteriskos to students) Finally, our priest will place a cross shaped metal strip, called the asteriskos, over all the pieces of bread on the paten and then a cloth is placed over all of it.

Father pours both water and wine into the chalice because when Christ was on the Cross, a solider pierced his side and both blood and water came out.

After this, Father will cut additional pieces of bread out of the prosphoro. He will cut out a large triangle for the Theotokos and place it on the paten. Who is the Theotokos? (The mother of God) Next, he will cut out 9 tiny triangles for the angels and all the saints. Finally, Father will remove more tiny pieces of bread from the prosphoro and place them on the paten for all the living (you and me) and the dead. God is surrounded by everyone on the paten.

Father will finish his prayers and place a cross-shaped piece of metal over the paten and then place a special cloth over the top of both the chalice and paten. He then censes it with a censer and the service of the Proskomide is completed.



After this, Father will cut additional pieces of bread out of the prosphoro. He will cut out a large triangle for the Theotokos and place it on the paten. Who is the Theotokos? (The mother of God) Next, he will cut out 9 tiny triangles for the angels and all the saints. Finally, Father will remove more tiny pieces of bread from the prosphoro and place them on the paten for all the living (you and me) and the dead. God is surrounded by everyone on the paten.

Father will finish his prayers and place a cross-shaped piece of metal over the paten and then place a special cloth over the top of both the chalice and paten. He then censes it with a censer and the service of the Proskomide is completed.




