ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM

Read Matthew 21:1-11

LOCATE ON THE MAP & VOCABULARY:

- Mount of Olives: a hill to the east of Jerusalem
- <u>Bethphage</u>: a place in ancient Israel, at the foot of the Mount of Olives: starting point of Jesus' ride into Jerusalem
- Jerusalem: a holy city in Israel and the location of the Jewish Temple
- **Zion**: a hill in Jerusalem, on which the Temple was built (used to symbolize the city itself, especially as a religious or spiritual center)

Jesus had been in Bethany, two miles east of Jerusalem, where He brought Lazarus back to life after being dead for four days. Many people witnessed this immense miracle and news spread quickly! Some of these witnesses went straight to Jerusalem to tell the the members of the Sanhedrin about the latest miracle Jesus had done. This was the straw that broke the camel's back, per se, for the Jewish council. They held a meeting and agreed that Jesus had to die in order to keep Rome from coming in and getting rid of them for not keeping the peace.

Meanwhile, Jesus starts traveling towards Jerusalem. They reach the foot of the east side of the Mount of Olives in Bethphage. This is when Jesus sends two disciples to get a young donkey for Him. Jesus rode this donkey into the great city of Jerusalem and a huge crowd began taking off their coats and laying them on the ground or placing palm branches from nearby trees along Jesus' path. It was not uncommon for the people to welcome victorious kings into the city in this manner and this was the first time the people were publicly proclaiming Jesus to be the Messiah, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM

Read Matthew 21:1-11

LOCATE ON THE MAP & VOCABULARY:

- Mount of Olives: a hill to the east of Jerusalem
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- **Zion**: a hill in Jerusalem, on which the Temple was built (used to symbolize the city itself, especially as a religious or spiritual center)

Jesus had been in Bethany, two miles east of Jerusalem, where He brought Lazarus back to life after being dead for four days. (Find Bethany and Jerusalem on the map.) We still remember this event every year on Lazarus Saturday. There was a crowd of people around

Lazarus' tomb because they wanted to see why his sisters had run out to his tomb. All the people witnessed the rock being rolled away from in front of the tomb, the stink that came out of the tomb because Lazarus' body had started to decompose, and when they saw Lazarus come out alive - it was shocking! The news of this miracle spread quickly! Some of the crowd went straight to Jerusalem to tell the Jewish council, called the Sanhedrin, about the latest miracle Jesus had done, while everyone else stayed in Bethany to rejoice with Lazarus and his sisters, Mary and Martha.

The Jewish council felt threatened by Jesus. They thought the Roman Empire would be upset with them for not keeping the peace in Jerusalem as many of the people believed that Jesus was the Messiah.

Meanwhile, Jesus starts traveling towards Jerusalem. Jesus and His disciples reach the bottom of the east side of the Mount of Olives in Bethphage. This is when Jesus sends two of His disciples to get a young donkey for Him. Jesus rode this donkey into the great city of Jerusalem and a huge crowd began taking off their coats and laying them on the ground or placing palm branches from nearby trees along Jesus' path. It was not uncommon for the people to welcome victorious kings into the city in this manner and this was the first time the people were publicly proclaiming Jesus to be the Messiah, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

The Jews believed that the Messiah would be a political king, so they welcomed Him just like they would any other victorious king entering the city. But...they misunderstood.
