JESUS HEALS THE MAN WITH THE WITHERED HAND Read Matthew 12:9-14

God provided the Jews with many rules in order to help guide them. Unfortunately, the Pharisees spent a great deal of effort following these rules when it benefited them most and in the process of strictly following the rules, they missed the bigger picture - to love, care, and show mercy towards one another.

Jesus endlessly tried to show them that they needed to love one another, but the Pharisees hearts had hardened and they just wanted to get rid of Jesus. St. Theophylact explains that they desired to destroy Jesus because they had separated themselves from God - "Then the Pharisees departed, and held a council against Him (Jesus), how they might destroy Him..." When united with God, evil does not reside within us.

MIRACLES

The Gospels are filled with accounts of Jesus healing people. These miracles happen without any extravagance or calling attention to Himself before or after the miracle occurs. He does so out of love for each and every one of us, never for His own glory or praise.

What is a miracle? (Ask your students in order to have a better understanding of their level of knowledge before continuing.)

A miracle is anything that cannot be explained. A miracle is difficult or impossible without God and leaves us in awe of Him.

Do miracles happen today? (Again, ask your students before continuing. If they respond no - why? If they respond yes - why?)
