The Life of Christ with Saint Luke



ANNUNCIATION TO MARY

Major feast day: March 25th Luke 1:26-38

The Archangel Gabriel visits Mary and announces to her that she will have a Son and she is to name Him, Jesus. (*Yeshua*, meaning "Yahweh saves" or "Savior") Mary asks how this will come to pass because she has never known a man. Mary and Joseph are betrothed (a very binding engagement), but they are not yet formally married and living together. Gabriel tells Mary, "The Holy

Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God." Mary willingly consented, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." Then Gabriel departed from her.


ACTIVITIES

Icon of the Annunciation

Show the icon to the students as you are reading Luke's gospel. Afterwards, ask them to summarize the story to you.

When we are asked to retell a story or lesson, our brain has to recall and organize the information we've received in order to retell it. Our brain then realizes this may be important information and is more likely to store it in long term memory, especially if we ask the students to recall the story again in the near future. (e.g. with parents at home or next week as part of a review)

Additionally, point out that we have two icons of the Annunciation in our church - a small one on the Royal Doors and a much larger one on the arch above the altar.



Timeline - What event occurred?

Use a post-it note or a piece of paper cut lengthwise to write a short summary about the Annunciation to Mary.

Options:

- One student writes the summary and places it on the timeline after the summary about St. John's parents
- A group of students collaborate to write the summary and place it on the timeline
- The students dictate a summary of the annunciation to the teacher and the teacher writes it down and places it on the timeline

Map - Where did the event occur?

Using the map of Israel in the classroom, locate Nazareth. Joseph and Mary traveled south through Judea to get to Bethlehem. Then find Bethlehem on the map.

NATIVITY OF CHRIST

Major feast day: December 25th Luke 2:1-20 Matthew 1:18-25

Joseph and Mary made their way from Nazareth in the north to Bethlehem, which is about 90 miles south. This journey would have taken them several days, especially with Mary being very pregnant.



Bethlehem is swarming with people who have traveled to register for the census and there isn't anywhere for them to stay. The only option remaining is a cave where someone kept their animals. Israel is largely a desert area and trees are not plentiful. Therefore, they use the rocky terrain surrounding them for many uses - one of them being a shelter for their animals. This is the humble birthplace of Christ.

ACTIVITIES

Icon of the Nativity of Christ

Show the icon to the students as you are reading Luke and Matthew's gospel. Afterwards, ask them to tell you about the icon. They will summarize the birth of Christ as they tell you about the icon.

Timeline - What event occurred?

Use a post-it note or a piece of paper cut lengthwise to write a short summary about the Nativity of Christ.

Map - Where did the event occur?

Bethlehem is located a relatively short distance from Jerusalem.

Presentation of Christ into the Temple

Major feast day: February 2nd Luke 2:22-38

The Theotokos and Joseph bring Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem when He is 40 days old.

We also bring our babies to church when they are 40 days old for a special blessing.



ACTIVITIES

Icon of the Presentation of Christ

Show the icon to the children as you are reading Luke gospel. Afterwards, ask them to tell you about the icon. They will summarize the Presentation of Christ as they tell you about the icon.

Timeline - What event occurred?

Use a post-it note or a piece of paper cut lengthwise to write a short summary about the Presentation of Christ into the Temple.
