ANNUNCIATION TO MARY

Major feast day: March 25th Luke 1:26-38

Mary lives in the city of Nazareth near the Sea of Galilee and she is betrothed (similar to saying engaged to someone today) to Joseph. The Archangel Gabriel visits her and tells her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!" She is troubled by a sudden appearance of an angel by her side. The angel soothes her by telling her not to be afraid. She is to have a Son

and name Him Jesus. Looking at the angel, Mary asked how this could be because she has not been with a man. The angel replied, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God."

In turn, Mary responded to the angel, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." And then Archangel Gabriel left.



ACTIVITIES

Icon of the Annunciation

Show the icon to the students as you are reading Luke's gospel. Afterwards, ask them to summarize the story to you.

When we are asked to retell a story or lesson, our brain has to recall and organize the information we've received in order to retell it. Our brain then realizes this may be important information and is more likely to store it in long term memory, especially if we ask the students to recall the story again in the near future. (e.g. with parents at home or next week as part of a review)

Additionally, point out that we have two icons of the Annunciation in our church - a small one on the Royal Doors and a much larger one on the arch above the altar.

Timeline - What event occurred?

Use a post-it note or a piece of paper cut lengthwise to write a short summary about the Annunciation to Mary.

Options:

 One student writes the summary and places it on the timeline after the summary about St. John's parents

Bethlehem is located a relatively short distance from Jerusalem.

NATIVITY OF CHRIST

Major feast day: December 25th Luke 2:1-20 Matthew 1:18-25

Joseph and Mary traveled from Nazareth to Bethlehem because of the required registration for the census. Everyone had to go to where their families were from. For Joseph, this meant going back to Bethlehem because he is a descendent of King David who was born there.

Bethlehem is swarming with people who have traveled far and wide to register for the census. There is absolutely no where for them to stay. The only option remaining is a cave where someone kept their animals. Israel is largely a desert area and trees are not plentiful. Therefore, they use the rocky terrain surrounding them for many uses one of them being a shelter for their animals. This is the humble birthplace of Christ.

Presentation of Christ into the Temple

Major feast day: February 2nd Luke 2:22-38

The Theotokos and Joseph bring Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem when He is 40 days old.

When our moms gave birth to us, many of them stayed home with us for 40 days (or 6 weeks) and then brought us to the church for our 40 day blessing, just like the Theotokos and Christ.


FOR PARENTS
