
JESUS' CHILDHOOD

The Life of Christ with Saint Luke



FLIGHT INTO EGYPT, THE SLAYING OF THE HOLY INNOCENTS, & RETURN HOME

Read Matthew 2:13-23 & Luke 2:39-40

In our last lesson, we were learning about the birth of Christ. This week, we are continuing to learn about Jesus' childhood. We don't know a whole lot about Jesus when he was younger. This is because the evangelists focused on telling us about Christ's ministry, teachings, miracles, death, and resurrection because this was the most important part: Jesus came for the salvation of all!

Herod Antipas: Son of Herod the Great; Orders St. John the Baptist's death; local ruler of Galilee & Perea



Herod Archelaus: Son of Herod the Great; Removed by the Roman Emperor & later replaced with Pontius Pilate; local

Today, we are learning about the last little glimpse we get of Jesus' childhood from the gospels.

In Matthew, we learn about how the magi had visited Herod the Great as they looked for the "King of the Jews." Herod informs them that he wants to find this king too and instructs them to return to him after they find the child. They, however, are warned in a dream not to return to Herod - and when Herod finds out, he's angry! He's so upset that he orders all of the male babies two years old and younger to be killed. He does not want to risk Jesus growing up and taking his spot!

Before Herod can carry out his plan, Joseph is warned in a dream to leave immediately for Egypt. He is instructed to stay there until Herod dies, which is not too long.

After Herod the Great's death, the land he ruled is split up amongst his children. Joseph is given instructions in a dream again that it's safe to leave Egypt and return to Israel. He learns that Herod's son, Archelaus is ruling in the region of Judea and it's not safe to stay there because he's just as ruthless as his father. So, they keep traveling and stay in the region of Galilee in the city of Nazareth instead. Herod the Great's son, Herod Antipas, is ruling in this area. We will hear more about him as we continue reading the Gospel of Luke.



Jesus Teaches in the Temple at Age 12

Read Luke 2:41-52

Jesus' family had traveled to Jerusalem from Nazareth for the Passover. This was a yearly feast celebrating their exodus out of Egypt when Moses had liberated the Hebrews and led them out of slavery.

Now remember, they don't have cars, trains, or planes during this time. The journey would have taken about 3 - 4 days to walk from Nazareth to Jerusalem. Family and friends would travel together in one big group. There could easily be

dozens of people camping together each night on the way there and back.

After Passover, everyone packed up and got ready for their journey back home. Oftentimes, the women and children would start walking at a slower pace before the men and the men would catch up with them later. Mary and Joseph had both assumed Jesus was with the other person as they walked back to Nazareth. The group had walked the entire day and as they camped for the night, both of them began looking all over for Jesus after they realized He wasn't with the other person, but they couldn't find Him. They now had to wait until morning to go looking for Him, walk an entire day back to Jerusalem, and then had to wait until the following morning before they could go looking for Him in the bustling, big city. Mary and Joseph finally found Jesus in the Temple! He was listening to the teachers and teaching them as well. Everyone was astounded with Jesus' wisdom and knowledge!


You can imagine how worried Mary would be as she frantically searched for her Son for days. When she found Him, she asked, "Son, why have You done this to us? Look, Your father and I have sought You anxiously."

Jesus responds to His mom, "Why did you seek Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?"

What did Jesus mean by this? Fr. Lawrence Farley explains, "The young Jesus does not answer disrespectfully, but He asks in return how it could be that they would not know where they could find Him. Where else could He be, but in the place where the Law of His Father was being taught? Did they not know that it was necessary for Him, as the designated Messiah, to be in the things of His Father?" 
