

Palm Sunday

Luke 19:28-40 Orthodox Children's Bible Reader: pages 230-232

Read or tell the story of Christ's entry into the city of Jerusalem and use the icon as a visual.

Ask the students to tell you about the icon afterwards as a review and to help them place the story in their long term memory.

ACTIVITY: OPTION 1

ACTIVITY: OPTION 2

Illustrate a "book" about Christ's entry into Jerusalem


Fold a piece of construction paper in half. On the front of their "book," write the title of their book (either you choose or let them choose) and they let them write their name (if able) under "by."

Instruct them to open their book and draw a picture of Christ riding a donkey into Jerusalem. After they finish illustrating their book, provide



them the choice of either reading their book (the pictures) to you, which is a review of the story or read their story using their drawings as a guide. Retell the story slightly different for each child. They get a big kick out of it.

Then ask them to take their book home and read the story to mom or dad for a bedtime story later that night.
